Forbes India Magazine has also featured a story on Amul titled "Cow to consumer: Beyond profit for Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation. The story says "Managed and run by the Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF), the Amul brand is owned by 18,536 village dairy cooperatives like the one in Sandesar and 3.6 million farmers from Gujarat.

GCMMF has established 9,000 Amul parlours (dedicated stores). GCMMF, which is headquartered in the nation's milk city of Anand in Gujarat, had an annual turnover of Rs 20,733 crore in FY15, a remarkable 159 percent growth from just five years ago when it had clocked Rs 8,005 crore.
